# The Center

The Center for Grieving Children is the only organization in the City of Philadelphia dedicated exclusively to supporting grieving children and their families. In four locations across the city and in over 70 schools, The Center provides free grief groups to children and youth who have lost a close loved one. The Center also holds post-crisis interventions in schools, community-based grief groups, and training for other professionals. Last year, The Center directly supported nearly 700 youth and 100 adult caregivers, provided post-crisis support impacting more than 6,000 youth, and trained 622 professionals to help grieving children.
